**1. Call to Order.**

1. August 1, 2022. Ben Zeller, County Judge, called to order the Commissioners Court Special Term for Monday, August 1, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

**2. Invocation and Pledges.**

2. August 1, 2022. Judge Ben Zeller opened the meeting with prayer and the reciting of the Pledges of Allegiance of the United States of America and the State of Texas.

**3. Citizens Communication.**

3. August 1, 2022. Judge Ben Zeller opened the meeting to anyone wishing to address general County business which was not on the meeting agenda.

Republican Chair Bill Pozzi stated the Republican party has the privilege to appoint a new person to be on the ballot in the November general election for County Treasurer due to the untimely passing of Sean Kennedy, the former Treasurer. Mr. Pozzi stated applications will be taken until this Friday at 5:30 p.m. and there is no filing fee or costs to run an election. On August 8, 2022, interviews will be held at the GOP headquarters at 5:30 p.m. for the appointment. Gay Patek, a Victoria County resident, stated that there are sexually explicit and gender-ideology books that are aged and content inappropriate for minors at the Victoria Public Library. She explained the contents of a few books, how they would affect the younger children, and quoted sections of the penal code relating to obscenity and pornography. She asked that policies be put in place at the library.

Michael Vonderau of 2204 E. North Street, Victoria, Texas, spoke about the problem with stolen catalytic converters. Mr. Vonderau stated he appreciated the air conditioner, computers, and the training classes at the Victoria Public Library. He also thanked Victoria County Animal Control for their lost and found department.

Gary Patek, a Victoria County resident, informed the Court about obscene and inappropriate books that are found in the Victoria Public Library for younger children. Mr. Patek read excerpts from these books found in the library for ages 8 and up and 12 and up.

Stan Reinke, a Victoria County resident, reported that inappropriate, sexually explicit, obscene literature that is in clear violation of Texas Penal Code 43.21, is being purchased with taxpayer money and made available to children ages 8 and older in the Victoria Public Library. He read a few quotes from books to the Court. He asked the Court to become aware of this literature and to exercise their authority to have this literature removed or put in a secured section.

Commissioner Gary Burns asked the public to inform the court and public of the arguments that people are using to justify this situation.

Judge Zeller stated that the public library is a City of Victoria department, paid for by city taxpayer dollars and Commissioners Court doesn't provide any oversight or funding to the library. He clarified that Victoria County owns the building, but does not fund the library. He commented that there are four seats on the Library Board that are appointed by the Court. He also stated that because this seems to be a community issue, the court is open to hear public input.

Ronnie Flake, a Victoria County resident, spoke about a book at the library for the age group 12 and over that shows illustrations of body parts and sex acts he found too vulgar to describe. He shared an excerpt from the book. Mr. Flake voiced his concerns and stated he is here to protect his children and grandchildren.

Wanda Ulrey, a Victoria County resident, voiced her concerns regarding books that have age inappropriate content available through the Victoria Public Library found in the juvenile picture book (ages 4-8), juvenile (ages 8-12), and young adult (ages 12 and up) sections. She stated the issue is about protecting the innocence of children with taxpayer's dollars. She requested the court research the issue for themselves and gain wisdom and discernment on how it might address the issue with the City of Victoria, as an entity receiving benefit from its use of a county building.

Allan Bassham, 904 Burkhart Road, Victoria, Texas, spoke to the Court about waste water management on his property. Mr. Bassham explained to the Court what he has done to help the water flow on his property and asked the Court to take a look at this situation. Commissioner Danny Garcia responded to Mr. Bassham.

Jim Hester, a Victoria County resident, spoke regarding the public library and about how important it is for people to know how to do things; however, he also shared information about the process of gender reassignment that isn't included in these books, and suicidal and mental health effects it could and has caused in individuals.

Dale Zuck, a Victoria County resident, reviewed books that contain inappropriate content that are available at the Victoria Public Library for age 12, and a picture book that was asked to be read to pre-kindergarteners. Mr. Zuck read excerpts from 2 books. Mr. Zuck stated the Commissioners Court has always made sound decisions and listened and asked the Court to use the power of its appointments and good sense to help save our hometown.

Commissioner Clint Ives mentioned that there is no funding going to the library, but it is the County's "house". Commissioner Ives stated he supports an eviction notice to City of Victoria, giving them 90 days to come to terms with this group or they can put the library somewhere else. He also stated this may be the opportunity Victoria County is looking for to renegotiate the Fire and EMS Interlocal Agreement and draw a hard line.

Commissioner Gary Burns recommended this group hold elected officials accountable and stated standards should be set. Commissioner Burns thanked this group for taking a stand.

Judge Zeller mentioned discussions are being had with the mayor regarding unwinding the interlocal agreement and welcomed other comments.

Commissioner Janak informed the Court of inappropriate statues that he had seen in other towns. Commissioner Janak thanked the group and asked the group to please get everyone to go vote in November.

Judge Zeller thanked the group for their attendance and engagement on the issue and commented that he could think of few things more important than safe guarding the innocence of our children. He stated the things the Commissioners Court can do are appointing members to the library board. There are four seats available for appointment next month. He encouraged anyone interested to apply.

Commissioner Garcia stated this is not a republican or democrat issue, but rather a moral issue. He would do his part to speak to the City Council about expectations for the people that elected him regarding what the building should be used for.

Commissioner Gary Burns questioned the courts authority to remove appointees from the board and Judge Zeller responded.

Fire Marshal Richard Castillo stated that due to no recent rain and the index numbers rising that a burn ban might be requested on next Monday's agenda.

Commissioner Clint Ives informed the Court that he has people calling and begging for a burn ban.

Hearing no further comments, Judge Ben Zeller continued with the next agenda item.
