1. Call to Order.

1. August 29, 2022. Ben Zeller, County Judge, called to order the Commissioners Court Special Term for Monday, August 29, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

2. Invocation and Pledges.

2. August 29, 2022. Judge Ben Zeller opened the meeting with prayer and the reciting of the Pledges of Allegiance of the United States of America and the State of Texas.

3. August 29, 2022. Judge Ben Zeller opened the meeting to anyone wishing to address general County business which was not on the meeting agenda.

Michael Vonderau, 2204 E. North Street, thanked Judge Zeller for the recent meet and greet with the State Senator. He also thanked everyone that was involved with the demolishment of William Offer School.

Chief Deputy Franklin introduced Hunter Gray, who is serving as a college interim at the Victoria County Sheriff's Office until the end of the year. Mr. Franklin provided background information on Mr. Gray.

Harley Fisk, a Victoria County resident, voiced his concerns about bullying from different individuals or groups and religions. Mr. Fisk stated a minority or small subset of a religious group is trying to bully the Commissioners Court, City Council, and citizens of Victoria to do what they want. He asked the Court to be aware of this bullying trying to happen. Commissioner Burns responded to Mr. Fisk about the difference between bullying and standing up for what a person believes.

10. August 29, 2022. Bob Henderson, Financial Agent for Victoria County, explained the process for the sale of the Texas Certificates of Obligations. Due to the official order period starting at 9:30 a.m. this morning and running until 10:30 a.m., Mr. Henderson

suggested tabling this until the Frost Bank underwriters have the opportunity to receive the definitive orders from the retail investors in order to make a definitive recommendation. If this is not received before the end of this meeting, then the Court will recess until 1:00 p.m. (1:35:11) Bob Henderson stated the order carried closed at 10:30 a.m. and the book of orders was reviewed. The County was oversubscribed in the long end, meaning there were more orders than bonds available. The certificates were able to be repriced, down by 3 basis points. The NITC is 3.914 percent. Mr. Henderson recommended that the Court accept this bid from Frost Bank. Tom Spurgeon, with McCall Parkhurst and Horton, spoke about state law limitations and the amount of money in the construction fund. Mr. Spurgeon stated that with a higher interest rate, bond proceeds could earn more.
